This year, HOMELINK has helped **57 families or individuals**, who were homeless or at risk of homelessness, into the safety of their own home, including one Ukrainian family whose own home in Ukraine no longer exists.



HOMELINK has been **helping people into housing** in the Lewes District since 1998 but there are still too many people who can't get help from the council due to a shortage of social housing.

These families cannot afford private rented accommodation due to the need for rent in advance and damage deposits.

HOMELINK offers **interest-free loans** to cover these costs. Loans are re-paid over several years at a mutually-agreed, affordable rate. HOMELINK also offers support and **signposting** to other agencies and services.

HOMELINK doesn't stop there! The charity also offers **small grants** for essential white goods, floor covering and other essential items as most properties are empty when clients move in.

HOMELINK also assists **prison leavers**, offering a grant for emergency B&B upon release, if they have nowhere else to go. The short respite allows time for finding a place in a hostel and for sorting job-seeker's advice.

HOMELINK is looking for **new trustees**, particularly those with experience of **safeguarding, data protection and fund-raising** but any skills offered would be much valued. It is very rewarding to be part of a friendly, ecumenical team.

And the **#LookCloser** campaign teaches everyone to learn the signs of exploitation and how to report it. 'Across the country, young people are being manipulated, sexually abused, forced to launder money and deal drugs. Exploitation isn't obvious. But it happens everywhere. And you can stop it.'

FSW works in partnership with the **Diocese of Chichester** to help support families across Sussex. Set up to help those on the margins of society, FSW works with families who are most at risk of slipping through the safety net offered by the state, and support parents as they try to ensure their children have the best start in life.

How it works

FSW's Family Support Practitioners are all **qualified professionals** who work intensively with individual families. They visit families at home to provide one-to-one emotional and practical support.

Who does it help?

Those struggling with:

- ◆ Low income and poverty
- ◆ Housing issues
- ◆ Mental/physical ill health
- ◆ Domestic violence
- ◆ School refusal/exclusion



What help is offered?

- ◆ Listening
- ◆ Parenting advice
- ◆ Money management skills
- ◆ Advocating on behalf of the family
- ◆ Providing food and clothing
- ◆ Group play sessions
- ◆ After-school & holiday activities

CARING FOR CREATION THIS CHRISTMAS

I did the Creation Care survey about 6 months ago and was challenged by the question: Do you offset your carbon footprint?

Carbon offsetting is when an individual, company or a country pays someone else to implement projects which avoid or remove emissions to. Calculating our carbon footprint should lead to behaviour changes which help lower global emissions. We can use one of these measuring tools to measure our footprint:

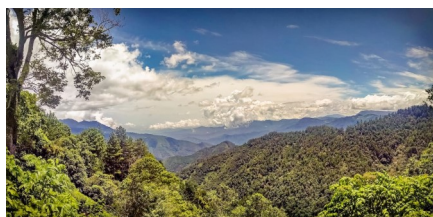
